*Cafeteria, media center, gym, fitness lab, arts annex




Lower Level - Theater Entrance





Transportation provided through limited satellite shuttle system for all students effective 1/6/09


Satellites buses go to Memorial Stadium, then to various programs







DSA 2015-2016 ACT Scores




